## What was amazing about my project and my experience of Hungary:

- ✓ The school was amazing!
- ✓ The students were so well-behaved and well-mannered during my time in the school, it really was an amazing experience to be able to teach them and improve their English skills, and knowledge in everything Australian (animals, climate, location, physical structures and geographic landforms etc).
- ✓ The teachers were extremely friendly and looked after me too much! They really did make sure that I was never (at any point in time) lost or uneasy about anything they organized my daily classes as well as most extra-curricular activities which I valued SO much! Their assistance and kind-mannered personalities were really appreciated (especially the English teachers)!
- ✓ The community was extremely welcoming and friendly!
- ✓ The host families were extremely kind and caring throughout the duration of my time here.
